Is Behavior Classroom Managed or Office Managed?

Classroom Managed – Minor Violations

- Horseplay
- Preparedness
- Calling Out
- Classroom Disruption
- Refusal to Follow a Reasonable Request (Insubordination)
- PDA
- Refusing to Work
- Inappropriate Tone/Attitude
- Electronic Devices
- Inappropriate comments/Language
- Food or Drink
- Dress Code (Hats/Hoodies)
- Cheating

1st - Conversation with student to reteach the desired expectations.

2nd – Students will complete a reflection/think sheet, buddy pass, or cool down pass. Submit Documentation Report for recurring behavior problem and **make contact with parent/guardian.**

3rd and beyond–Office level intervention/referral

Office Managed- Major Violations

- 3 or more classroom managed behavior problems
- Weapons
- Fighting or Aggressive Physical Contact
- Aggressive Language –Including directed at student/staff
- Threats

Teacher - Submit Referral (Office)

Administrator - Determines consequence and follows through on consequence.

Administrator - Provides teacher feedback via online referral



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Classroom managed behaviors: Minor problem behavior definitions

Defiance: Student engages in brief or low-intensity failure to follow directions or talks back

Classroom disruption: Student engages in low-intensity, but inappropriate disruption

Dress code: Student wears clothing that is near, but not within, the dress code guidelines defined by the school/district.

Disrespect: Student delivers low-intensity, socially rude or dismissive messages to adults or students

Technology violation: Student engages in non-serious, but inappropriate (as defined by school) use of cell phone, pager, music/video players, camera, and/or computer.

Inappropriate language: Student engages in low-intensity instance of inappropriate language.

PDA: Student engages in non-serious, but inappropriate physical contact. Student engages in inappropriate, consensual (as defined by school) verbal and/or physical gestures/contact, of a sexual nature to another student/adult.

Cheating: Student delivers message that is untrue and/or deliberately violates rules.

Avoidance of tasks(refusing to work): Student engages in problem behaviors(s) to get away/escape from tasks and/or activities.

Office Managed: Major Problem Behavior Definitions

Defiance/disrespect: Student delivers socially rude or dismissive messages to adults or students.

Weapons: Student is in possession of knives (> 6 in., < 6 in.) and guns (real or look alike), or other objects readily capable of causing bodily harm.

Fighting/ Aggressive behavior: Student engages in actions involving serious physical contact where injury may occur (e.g., hitting, punching, hitting with an object, kicking, hair pulling, scratching, etc.).

Aggressive Language: Student delivers verbal messages that include swearing, name calling, or use of words in an inappropriate way.

Harassment/Intimidation of student or staff: The delivery of disrespectful messages in any format related to gender, ethnicity, sex, race, religion, disability, physical features, or other protected class.

Truancy/skipping class/leaving school grounds: Student is late (as defined by the school) to class or the start up of the school day (and Tardy is not considered a minor problem behavior in the school). Student receives an 'unexcused absence' for ½ day or more. Student leaves or misses class without permission

Technical/electronic/AUP violations: Student engages in inappropriate (as defined by school) use of cell phone, pager, music/video players, camera, and/or computer.

Smoking/alcohol/drugs: Student is in possession of or is using alcohol. Student is in possession of or is using illegal drugs/substances or imitations. Student is in possession of or is using tobacco.

Vandalism: Student participates in an activity that results in destruction or disfigurement of property.

Dress code: Student wears clothing that does not fit within the dress code guidelines practiced by the school/district.

Excessive PDA: Student engages in inappropriate, consensual (as defined by school) verbal and/or physical gestures/contact, of a sexual nature to another student/adult.
